FOREWORD

Dear Bishop, and Fellow Partners;

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

I have the honor and pleasure to transmit you the report summarizing the main activities accomplished by our parishes in 2020. This report provides in part a portrait of the efforts, achievements and love that the Parish Leaders bring to our Archdeaconry. The report included two main parts: the general presentation of Hanika Archdeaconry and the activities carried out by each of its parishes in 2020.

At the very beginning of this report, I would like to point out that the year 2020 has not been favorable for the churches as it has not been for other sectors of activity. In Rwanda, since March 15, almost all activities that were planned have been suspended and all churches have been closed. At the time of writing this report, only 4 out of 36 churches in our archdeaconry have been recently opened. These are: Butansinda, Nyamagana, Hanika and Gasoro.

The closure of churches has had a negative impact on the lives of Christians and on pastors and their families. Like the other strata of social life, the pastoral ministry has also been seriously affected. Social distancing helped slow the spread of Covid-19, but also it increased our loneliness and anxiety during this time. Indeed, in Rwandan context, congregants have a great affinity with coming praying and worshipping God together. If then things changed to the point the pastor could not even lay his hands on the believers, this had a great impact.

Despite all these challenges, our pastors continued to play their primordial role of keeping and feeding the flock of God. God has really been and is still always there with our pastors and their families and with our parishioners. Every parish of Hanika Archdeaconry responded at some level to the Covid-19 by maintaining worship life and connections. Pastors tried keeping being in touch with parishioners via phone, local radio, TV through messages, etc. This showed me that we can maintain physical distance while being socially and spiritually close.

As Archdeacon, my role has always been to coordinate: support all parishes to develop an action plan for their preparedness and response. One of the common answers provided by all

the parishes of my archdeaconry is the prayer organized by each family on Sunday. This has been very beneficial for the Church. It was one of the ways of resolving conflicts and thus of maintaining family unity. It allowed members of the whole family to be more aware of their role in the life of the Church.

Our pastors encouraged the congregants. They tried to remind them that God is still in the business of protecting his own and to stay strong until the Lord's delivering power is fully exerted over the Covid-19 outbreak. They encouraged people to find space inside their homes and to worship God intimately and individually, even as gathering together has become impossible.

Besides spiritual encouragement, people also need the assurance that when they are in need, they will get the help. So, pastors tried to help meet the physical needs of our congregants too. This was about urging Christians to help each other and to reflect God's concern for all people, especially the most vulnerable, advising those who have lost jobs to integrate other businesses such as agriculture, livestock, small trade, and others. These activities keep pastors working, trying to sustain a sense of community and build hope among people. At the same, pastors worked on other issues like those caused by the climate change which affected our country between March and May: support those whose homes have been destroyed, etc.

Despite the effects of Covid-19 pandemic, our parishes have also made efforts to accomplish some activities that were on the normal agenda for 2020, especially those related to the rehabilitation of the church buildings and pastors' homes, hygiene; etc.

This report attempts to tell about the work done in our Archdeaconry during this hard time; but it is also always possible to communicate with the parish leaders for more information or to ask questions if need is. To end, I am thankful to God for his protection and to everyone who contributed, directly or indirectly to the realization of the activities related to in this report.

BACKGROUND

SHYOGWE DIOCESE

Shyogwe Diocese is one of eleven (11) Dioceses which make up the Anglican Church of Rwanda. Shyogwe Diocese started in 1992. It has four archdeaconries; thirty four (34) parishes and 147 sub-parishes with a total of 25,840 Christians located in four Districts: Kamonyi, Muhanga, Ruhango, and Nyanza of the Southern Province of Rwanda. It has 616 home groups (grassroots churches).

As a Church, Shyogwe Diocese has a role to provide a healing ministry to the many traumatized people in Rwanda and working towards reconciliation, restoration, and rehabilitation of the people. The Church has also been involved in rural development, medical work, vocational training, and education.

The vision of Shyogwe Diocese is “*Your Kingdom Come!*” This motto is shared through the integral mission of “*A holy soul in a healthy body.*” The Main mission is “*to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to all the people and contribute to the socioeconomic, cultural, intellectual, health development of Rwandan people*”. The core values which support, inform and guide the work of the Diocese at all levels are Excellence in execution; Integrity; Teamwork; Respect; Commitment and hard work.

Shyogwe Diocese carries out activities related to the following important Ministries: Evangelism and Discipleship; Education; Healthcare and Transformational Development.

Hanika archdeaconry

Hanika Archdeaconry is one of the four archdeaconries that make up EAR, Shyogwe Diocese. So far, this coordination body is made of ten (10) Parishes: Hanika, Nyamagana, Nyagisozi, Butansinda, Rubona, Tambwe, Kabuga, Kirombozi, Sholi, and Gahombo. The total number of church members is **7915** according to the statistics dated July 2019. It has seven schools: G.S Nyamagana; GS Gahombo; GS Nyarutovu; GS Hanika; EP Kabuga and Hanika Anglican Integrated (High Learning Institution). Hanika Archdeaconry has one (1) Health Center and two (2) Health Posts: Hanika Health Center and Kibinja Health Post. Its headquarters are situated in Hanika Parish-in Nyanza Town.



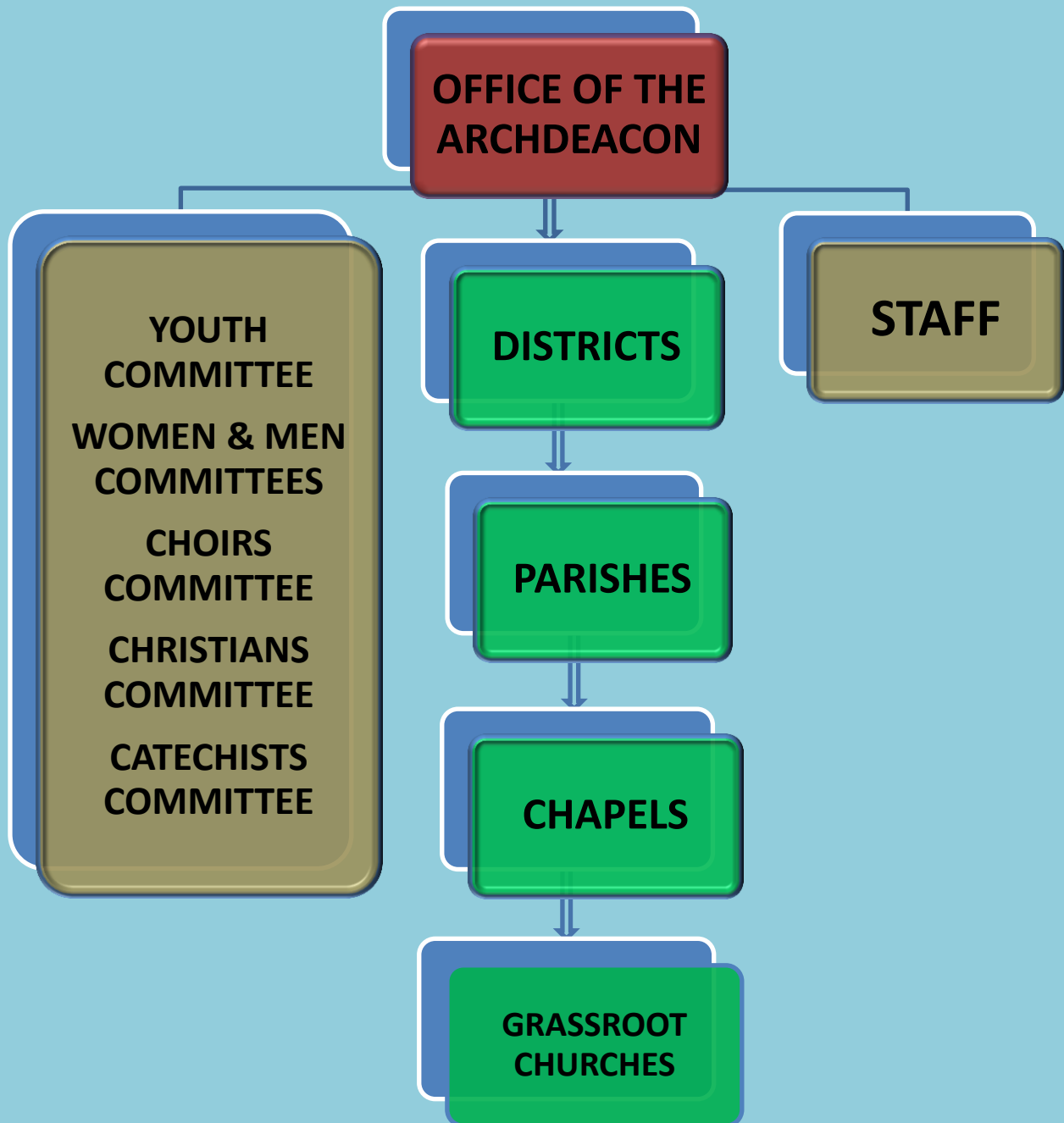
The Archdeacon

CARRIED OUT ACTIVITIES

I. Butansinda Parish



Butansinda is one of the parishes of the Anglican Church of Rwanda, Shyogwe Diocese, Hanika Archdeaconry. It was one of the chapels of Nyamagana Parish. It is located very closer to the National Road Kigali-Butare-Akanyaru. Initially, the parish had initiated 8 small chapels; but currently, following the requirements of the Rwandan Government in relation to prevent the spread of Covid Pandemic, security and cleanliness, seven chapels are closed. Butansinda believers have made every effort to reopen one chapel that currently operates (Butansinda chapel) and they are struggling to fulfill the necessary requirements for the reopening of the remaining other chapels.

Added to this is an urgent project to make the Pastor's house habitable. Indeed, the Parish has already made considerable efforts to build the pastor's home. However, due to the limited economic resources, it was not possible to complete the construction of this house. The pastor and his

family were living in poor conditions. During this year, some efforts have been deployed to change the situation. In the following pages we will relate other main activities accomplished in this period, but it is logical that a lot of the activities that were initially planned have not been carried out following the Covid-19 pandemic.

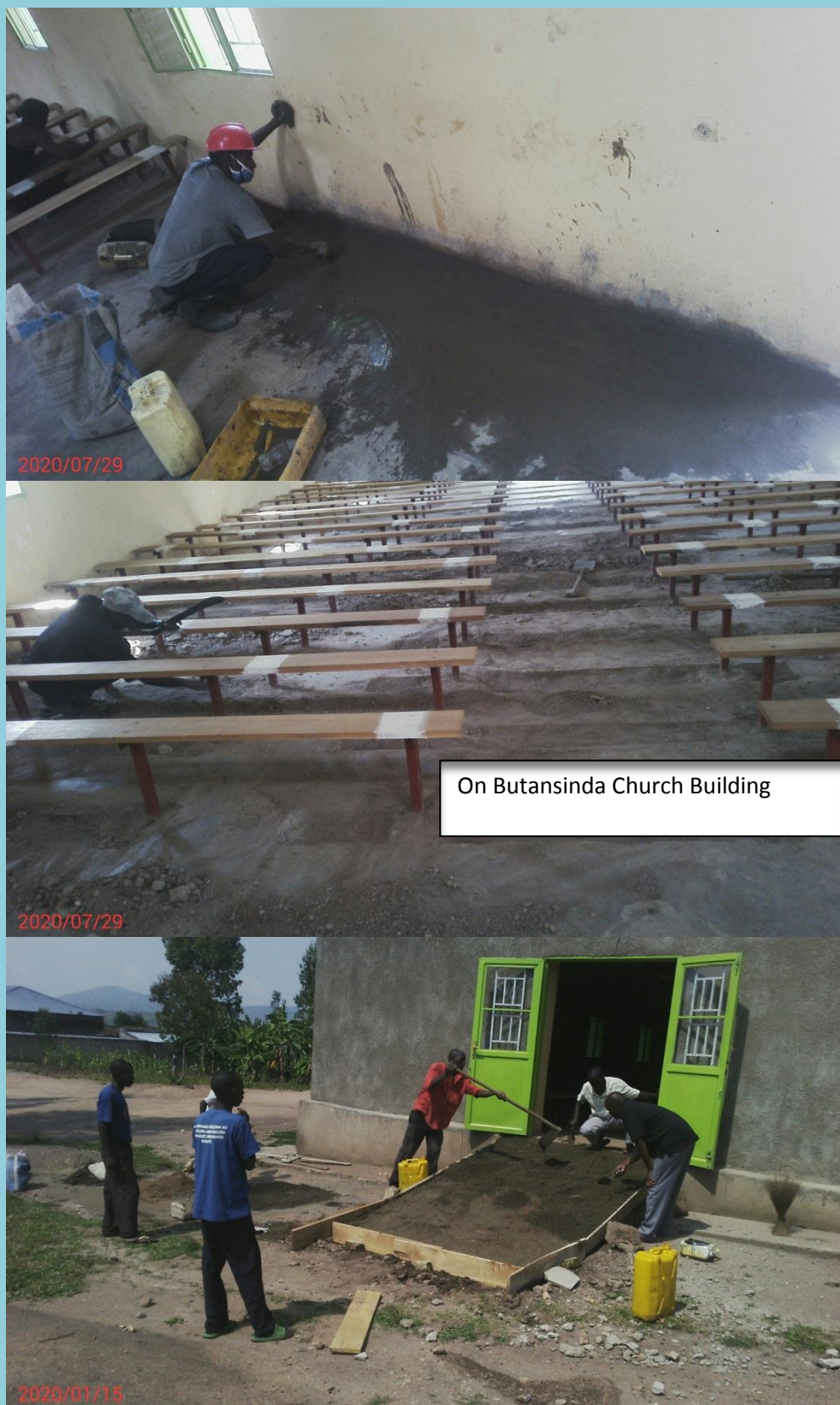
Accomplishments

1. The finishing work on the dwelling house of the parish pastor was continued. This year we have focused on the sanitary facilities (the installation of the shower and the toilet).





2. The finishing works on church buildings were carried out to fulfill the requirements of the Rwandan Government in relation to hygiene, security and the fight against the spread of Covid-19.

4. Diakonia: Food was provided to the twenty neediest families during the Quarantine period. The activity was made possible by members of Mothers Unions who visited families to reassure themselves of their survival.
5. Pastoral visits were made to 100 families to maintain contact between the Church and believers.
6. The Pastor has made visits to chapels, grass-root and Nyarutovu School (Butansinda Church Owned School). The crucial problem that chapels are facing is that they have not been able to meet Government requirements reason why some all of them except Butansinda are still closed.
7. Church Meetings: Different meetings were organized at the chapel and parish level.
8. Contribution to the Community Development: Butansinda Parish has contributed in the construction of a dwelling house of one of the needy people that the state authorities chose for benefic of this help.

II. Nyagisozi Parish



Nyagisozi parish is one of the parishes of the Anglican Church of Rwanda, Shyogwe Diocese, Hanika Archdeaconry. It has been created in 1985 and stated with the following chapels: Nyagisozi, Gahombo, Musenyi, Kareba, Kidaturwa, Nyarurama, Cyeru, Nyabitare, and Ntongwe. The parish gave birth to two parishes which are Gahombo and Cyeru. Also, the parish conceded one chapel (Nyarurama) to Cyimana Parish. To date, twelve (12) pastors have been priests of Nyagisozi parish. The parish has 1 school, 5 chapels (Nyagisozi, Ntongwe, Kareba, Kidaturwa and Ruko). In the following pages we will relate the main activities accomplished in the year 2020.

Accomplishments

Rubona sub-Parish

Historical background

As matter of fact, Rubona is a sub-parish that is located in southern province, Ruhango district, Bweramana sector, Rubona cell and Nyagasozi village. The sub-parish has 2 chapels. It has 214 believers, 81 women, 31 men, 29 youths, 73 children. Indeed the believers of Rubona sub-parish, most of them are farmers.

Tambwe Parish

Tambwe Parish started on January 06, 2005. It was a chapel of Nyamagana Parish. It started with five Chapels: Tambwe, Muhororo, Kayenzi, Nyabitare and Mataba. The parish started with 550 parishioners. The 1st parish pastor was Fidele Ndutiye. Others pastors who have been to Tambwe are: Muhawenimana Assa, Uzabakiriho Claver, Karambizi Desire, Nsengimana Callixte and Ndaribumbye Francois. In 2009, Tambwe ceded two chapels to Cyeru Parish. It remained with 3 chapels. After, it started a new chapel at Gikoma. The parish has its territorial jurisdiction over Ruhango and Mbuye Sectors.

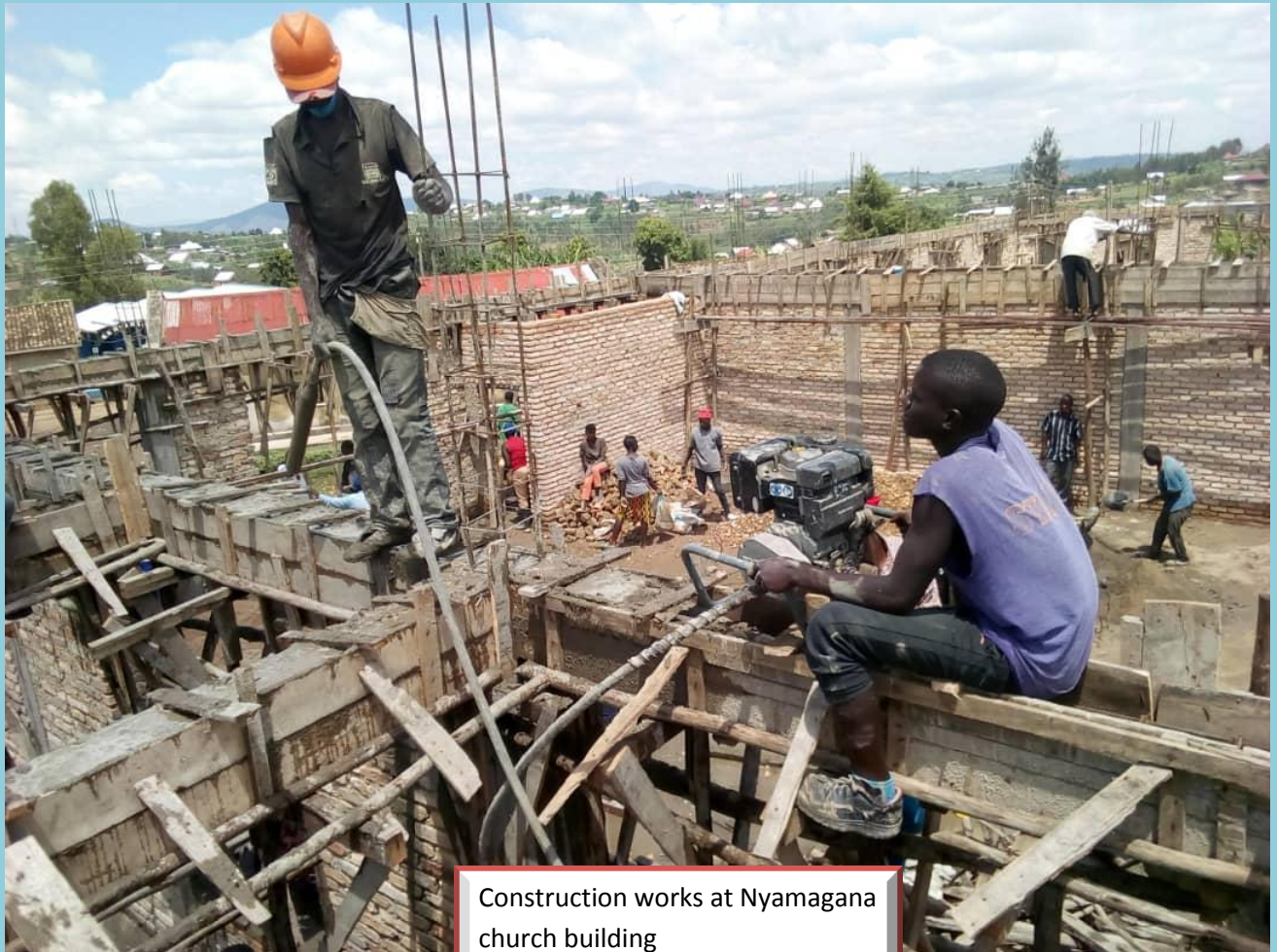

Hanika Parish



Hanika Parish is located in Nyanza District, Busasamana Sector, Kavumu Cell, Gihisi Village. The parish owns two schools, GS Hanika and Hanika AIP. The Parish started in 1945 and gave birth to many parishes: Rusatira, Ndago, Kibinja, Nyanza, Nyamagana, Kabuga and Shori sub-Parish.

Activities

This report summarizes all the work done in the following domains: Evangelism; Family Promotion and Development.

EVANGELISM

A three-day Evangelism Camp on the theme “Hanika liberation” was organized. We have created 2 social media sites (WhatsApp, and YouTube channel), so that we can continue evangelism in lockdown and it is still

working and productive. Members of MU&FU in partnership with the Pastor of the Parish visited 87% of the Christians of HANIKA Parish i.e. 194 families. We did evangelism in groups. We held meetings and prayers: during church service (13/52 weeks) and during special occasions.

FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

In this area, we have done various tasks including: helping the needy; training of different classes of Christians in unity and reconciliation; reducing youth unemployment; etc. We trained the youth (2 times): on Reproductive health and drug prevention (in collaboration with Hanika Health Center and the Project supported by Compassion International) .We have trained the youth in saving.

UNITY AND RECONCILIATION

In collaboration with Busasamana Sector, Hanika Parish was able to help 8 people to pay for the property they have damaged in the 1994 during the Genocide against Tutsi. We have also conducted a short-term training for Christians on different themes of reconciliation.

DEVELOPMENT

- Renovating of Gacu and Mpanga church buildings.
- Fundraised for the construction of Hanika parish church building: we already have more than 500,000, FRW and about 1200,000 FRW will be donated no later than the January 2021.
- Mukoni church roofing completed



- Hand washing facility at Hanika Chapel
- Construction works on Hanika memorial site for the victims of the April 1994 Genocide committed against Tutsi.
- We bought the land for Remera chapel
- We planted cassava on the land we bought in Remera, as well as on a small part of the parish land.
- We cleared the Forest of the Parish
- We planted 2,900 trees in the parish land
- We planted 100 trees at Mukoni church
- We planted 100 trees at Mpanga church
- We planted 250 trees at Gacu church

Sholi Sub-Parish



Sholi sub-Parish is located in southern Province, Nyanza District, Kigoma Sector, Butara Cell, Kavumu Village. It started on 14/07/2017 with Mr. Kabanda Tito as Evangelist. It has four chapels: Shori and Gasoro detached from Hanika Parish; Kigoma and Nyakabungo detached from Butansinda Parish. Two chapels are now closed and only Gasoro is open. The Sub-parish has 845 believers.

Activities

1. We visited Christians at home because the churches were closed (60% were visited).
2. We held home prayers. The 48 families met weekly between May and November.
3. We are continuing to build Kavumu church building
4. In Shori and Gasoro we have built 2 kindergarten classrooms

Gahombo-Parish



Gahombo Parish started its activities in 2005. It has 3 chapels; 20 prayer cell groups, 894 Christians. It has one high school and a Project supported by Compassion International to rise up children from poor families.

Kirombozi Parish started in 1993 with Nzamwita Celestin as Parish Pastor. Other Pastors who lived in Kirombozi are: Rev. Gahamanyi Gaspard, Rev. Kamanzi Evariste, Rev. Ndaribumbye Francois and Rev. Sekamana Jean.

Kirombozi Parish is located in Nyanza District, Cyabakamyi Sector, Nyarurama Cell, Rugote Village. Kirombozi Parish is made of five Chapels: Kirombozi, Rwamagana, Nzuki, Runyengando and Kerezo. The parish has almost 800 Christians.

Activities

Due to the impact of Covid-19, we have not done many activities. During Lockdown, Christians have not been able to meet again apart from some arrangements made by each family meeting on Sunday at home. The families which have been able to meet this vary between 24 and 17 families each week.
